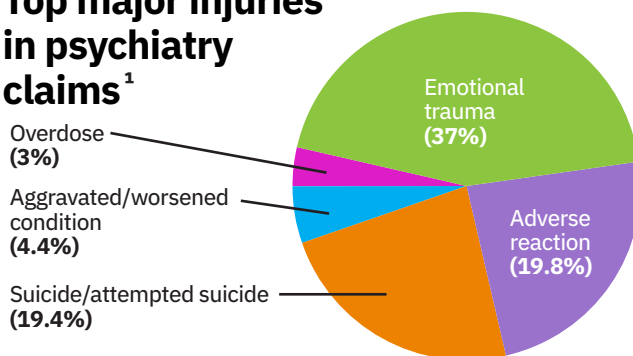

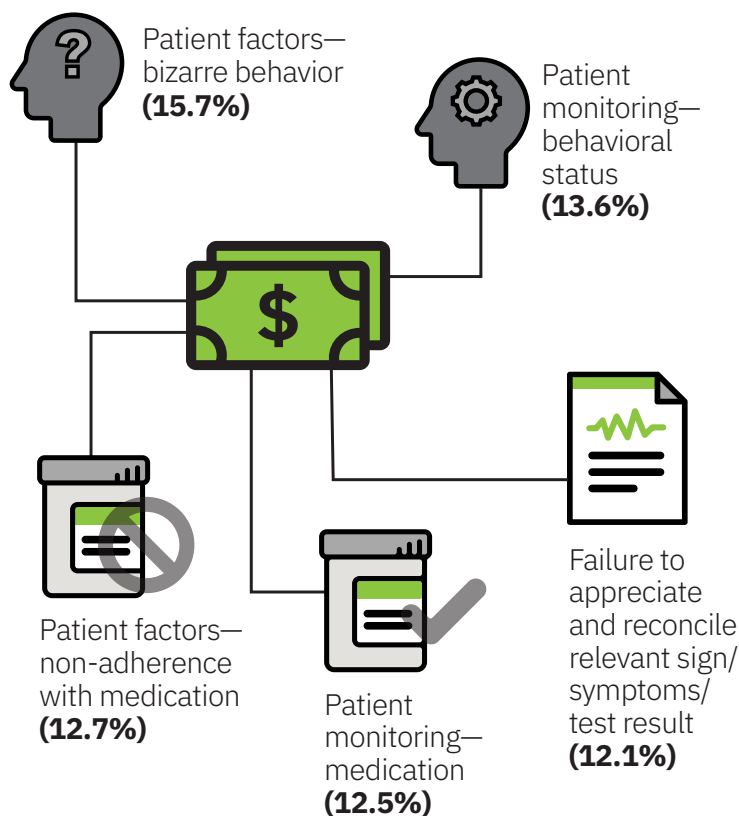
Top allegations in psychiatry claims¹

(73 cases, \$411.2 average indemnity)

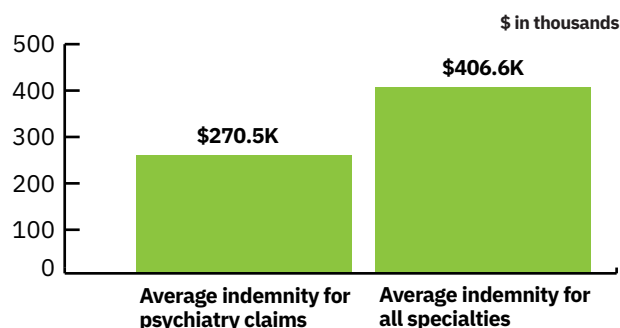
Top major injuries in psychiatry claims¹



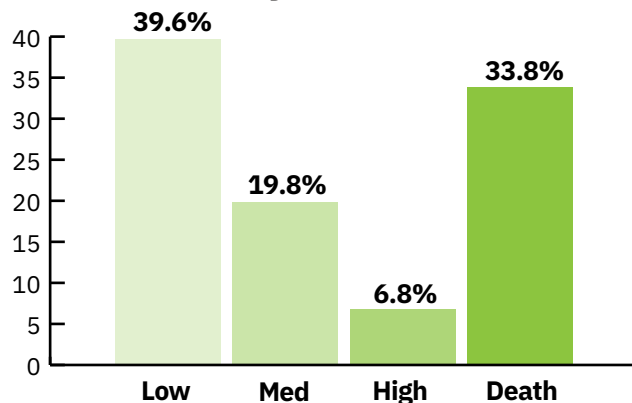
Top contributing factors¹

Clinical severity¹



Low = Temporary insignificant injury or emotional only
Medium = Temporary major or permanent minor injury
High = Permanent significant, major, or grave injury
Death = Adult, child, infant, or fetal death
